Miami, FL, August, 2017– Ever wonder what happens to all the tomatoes that don't get picked at the farm? All the kale and avocados that don't get sold? [Hungry Harvest](#) rescues these fruits & vegetables and delivers them directly to customer's doorsteps.

Following successful launches in Baltimore, Washington, DC and Philadelphia, Hungry Harvest makes its South Florida debut this summer.

Hungry Harvest, the Shark Tank startup, is on a mission to end food waste and hunger in the US by rescuing delicious produce that farmers can't otherwise sell due to cosmetic imperfections or farmer surpluses. This produce is curated into weekly harvest boxes and delivered directly to subscribers starting at just \$17.

For every box purchased, one to two pounds of produce will be donated to [Lotus House](#) a local organization dedicated to improving the lives of homeless women, youth and children. Since 2014, Hungry Harvest has rescued over 3 million pounds of produce from going to waste and donated over 500 thousand pounds to communities in need.

About Hungry Harvest

Hungry Harvest was founded in 2014 in the basement of a University of Maryland dorm room after CEO Evan Lutz learned that in the US, 40% of food goes to waste and 1 in 6 people go hungry. The company aims to use one problem to solve the other by rescuing produce that would otherwise go to waste, delivering it to consumers, and donating produce to fight hunger. Hungry Harvest has appeared on Shark Tank, spoken at TedTalks, is endorsed by Whole30 and is a recognized partner in the war on food waste by the James Beard Foundation's Chef Action Network.
